SUNDAY REFLECTION

Today, the Pharisees want to put Jesus to the test again, and they propose to him the question of divorce. But, instead of giving them a definite answer, Jesus asks them in return what the Scriptures say and, without criticizing Moses' Law, makes them understand that while that Law is legitimate, it is only temporal: "Because of the hardness of your hearts he wrote you this commandment" (Mk 10:5).

Jesus reminds them what Genesis says: "But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female" (Mk 10:6; cf. Gn 1:27). Jesus speaks here of the unity of Humankind. Man will leave father and mother and will join his wife, and the two shall become one flesh to form Mankind. This represents a new reality: Two human beings form a unity, not as an "association", but as a generator of Humanity. The conclusion is quite evident: "what God has joined together, no human being must separate." (Mk 10:9).

If we look at marriage as an association, its indissolubility cannot be fathomed. If marriage is just a matter of associated interests, we can then understand its dissolution may appear as legitimate. In this case, speaking of marriage in these terms is disdainful, because it refers only to the association of two single persons who have decided to make their lives more pleasant. When the Lord speaks of marriage, He is referring to something else. The Vatican II Council reminds us: «For the good of the spouses and their off-spring as well as of society, the existence of the sacred bond no longer depends on human decisions alone. For, God Himself is the author of matrimony, endowed as it is with various benefits and purposes. All of these have a very decisive bearing on the continuation of the human race» (Gaudium et spes, n. 48).

Back home, the Apostles asked him again about the demands of marriage, and this is followed by the tender scene with the infants. Both passages are related. The second lesson is like a parable that explains how the marriage is possible. The Kingdom of God is for those that become as infants and accept to build something new. And marriage is the same if we really understand what it actually means, that is: to leave, to join and to become.

APOSTOLAT POLSKI

ROZWAŻANIE NA NIEDZIELE

Dzisiaj, faryzeusze ponownie wystawiają Jezusa na próbę przedstawiając mu kwestię rozwodu. A Jezus udzielając więcej niż ostatecznej odpowiedzi, zadaje im pytanie o to, co mówi Pismo. I nie krytykując Mojżesza tłumaczy im, że jego Prawo jest legalne, lecz tymczasowe: «Przez wzgląd na zatwardziałość serc waszych napisał wam to przykazanie» (Mk 10,5). Pan Jezus przypomina, co o tej kwestii mówi Księga Rodzaju: «Na początku stworzenia Bóg stworzył ich jako kobietę i mężczyznę» (Mk 10,6, cf. Rdz 1,27). Pan Jezus mówi o jedności, którą będzie Ludzość. Mężczyzna opuszcza swoich rodziców, by złączyć się z żoną, aby być z nią w jedności, by tworzyć Ludzkość. To ozncza nową rzeczywistość: Dwa byty tworzą jedność, ale nie jako "stowarzyszenie", lecz jako współtwórcy Ludzkości. Wniosek jest prosty: «Co Bóg złączył, tego człowiek niech nie rozdziela» (Mk 10,9).

Dopóki wyobrażamy sobie małżeństwo jako "stowarzyszenie", jego nierozerwalność będzie dla nas niezrozumiała. Rozwiązanie małżeństwa wydaje się jakby uzasadnione, jeśli jego cele redukuje się do partnerstwa. Wówczas mówienie o małżeństwie jest nadużyciem językowym, bowiem jest to wtedy związek dwojga samotnych osób, które pragną uprzyjemnić sobie życie. Kiedy Pan mówi o małżeństwie, ma na myśli coś zupełnie innego. Sobór Watykański II przypomina nam: «Ten święty związek, ze względu na dobro tak małżonków i potomstwa, jak i społeczeństwa, nie jest uzależniony od ludzkiego sądu. Sam bowiem Bóg jest twórcą małżeństwa obdarzonego różnymi dobrami i celami. Wszystko to ma ogromne znaczenie dla trwania rodzaju ludzkiego» (Gaudium et spes, n. 48).

Po powrocie do domu Apostołwie wciąż pytają o wymagania małżeństwa, a potem ma miejsce pełna czułości scena z dziećmi. Oba te obrazy łączą się ze sobą. Ta druga nauka jest przenośnią, która wyjaśnia sens małżeństwa. Królestwo Boże jest dla tych, którzy potrafią być jak dzieci i przyjmują dar stworzenia. Tak samo jest w małżeństwie, jeśli dobrze rozumiemy co ono oznacza: opuścić, połączyć się i stwarzać.




CATECHISM of the CATHOLIC CHURCH

To nod with your head at this is not enough. Christians must adopt Jesus' way of life.
