SUNDAY REFLECTION

Today in the middle of Advent, the Word of God presents to us the Holy Precursor of Jesus Christ: Saint John the Baptist. God the Father prepared the coming, that is, the Advent, of his Son in our flesh, born of the Virgin Mary, in many ways and in many forms, as the beginning of the Letter to the Hebrews says (1:1). The patriarchs, the prophets and the kings prepared the coming of Jesus.

Let us look at his two genealogies in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. He is the son of Abraham and David. Moses, Isaiah and Jeremiah announced his Advent and described the characteristics of his mystery. But St. John the Baptist, as the liturgy says (Preface of his feast), was able to point him out with his finger, and it was his task - mysteriously! - to Baptize the Lord. He was the last witness before the coming. And he was so with his life, with his death and with his word. His birth is also announced, like that of Jesus, and is prepared, according to the Gospel of Luke (chapters 1 and 2). And his death as a martyr, victim of the weakness of a king and the hatred of a wicked woman, also prepares that of Jesus. For this reason, he received the extraordinary praise of Jesus himself that we read in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke (cf. Mt 11:11; Lk 7:28): "Among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist." In the face of this, which he could not ignore, he is a model of humility: "I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals" (Lk 3:16), he tells us today. And, according to St. John (3:30): "He must increase: I must decrease."

Let us hear his word today, which exhorts us to share what we have and to respect justice and the dignity of all. Let us thus prepare ourselves to receive the One who comes now to save us, and will come again to "judge the living and the dead".

APOSTOLAT POLSKI

ROZWAŻANIE NA NIEDZIELE

Dzisiaj Słowo Boże w środku Adwentu przedstawia Świętego Poprzednika Jezusa Chrystusa: Jana Chrzciciela. Bóg Ojciec postanowił przygotować Adwent, to znaczy przyjście Syna z naszego ciała, narodzonego z Maryi Dziewicy, na różne sposoby, jak głosi początek Listu do Hebrajczyków (1,1). Patriarchowie, prorocy i królowie przygotowali przyjście Jezusa.

Spójrzmy na genealogie Ewangelii Mateusza i Łukasza. Jest On potomkiem Abrahama i Dawida. Mojżesz, Izajasz i Jeremiasz zapowiedzieli jego Przyjście i opisali okoliczności tego cudu. Lecz oto Jan Chrzciciel zgodnie z liturgia (Prefacja do jego Święta) mógł wskazać Go palcem i cudownie udzielił mu Chrztu Pańskiego. Był on ostatnim świadkiem przed objawieniem. Świadectwem było jego życie, jego śmierć i jego słowo. Jego narodzenie także było zapowiedziane, i tak jak narodzenie Jezusa zostało przygotowane według Ewangelii Łukasza (rozdz. 1 i 2). A męczeńska śmierć Jana, ofiara słabości króla i nienawiści perwersyjnej kobiety, także przygotowuje przyjście Pana Jezusa. Dlatego otrzymał on wyjatkowa pochwałę od samego Jezusa, jak czytamy w Ewangeliach Mateusza i Łukasza (cf. Mt 11,11; Łk 7,28): «Między narodzonymi z niewiast nie powstał większy od Jana Chrzciciela». Wobec tego nie pozostał obojętny i stał się wzorem pokory: «Nie jestem godzien rozwiązać Mu rzemyka u sandałów» (Łk 3,16). A według Jana (3,30): «Potrzeba, by On wzrastał, a ja się umniejszał».

Wsłuchajmy się dziś w jego słowa, abyśmy umieli się dzielić tym, co mamy i oddawali sprawiedliwość i szanowali godność innych. W ten sposób przygotujmy się na przyjęcie Tego, który przychodzi, aby nas zbawić, a ponownie przybędzie, aby «sądzić żywych i umarłych».

Who created the world?

The Father is the Creator, the Almighty. The Son is the meaning and heart of the world: "All things were created through him and for him" (Col 1:16). We find out what the world is good for only when we come to know Christ and understand that the world is heading for a destination: the truth, goodness, and beauty of the Lord. The Holy Spirit holds everything together; he is the one "that gives life" (Jn 6:63).

The Advent Wreath

Each candle in the Advent wreath has a significant meaning, but the third candle of Advent has an unusual

place. In most advent wreaths, it is the one candle that is a different color than the others. There is something unique, more spontaneous, and celebratory about the theme of the third week of Advent compared to the others.

What Does the Third Week of Advent Candle Stand for?

The advent wreath has had many variations since it was invented in 1839. but the most common version has four candles inside a wreath. The first advent candle ("The Prophet's Candle") stands for hope. The second candle ("The Bethlehem Candle") stands for peace. The fourth candle ("the Angel's Candle") stands for love. The third candle, also known as "the Shepherd's Candle," stands for joy. Each candle is lit on a different Sunday leading up to Christmas Day. Some Christians also include a fifth candle, a white one representing Jesus himself, in the middle of the Advent wreath and light it on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.

Why Celebrate Advent?

Advent is a wonderful celebration to share with your entire family, young to old. It's a time to draw closer to God and closer together.

There are three main reasons to celebrate Advent:

- 1. Advent helps us focus on the reason for the Christmas season and prepare our hearts to receive the gift God gave when He sent His Son, Jesus, to live among us. Advent is an intentional time of focusing our hearts on Him and the promises He has, and will continue to fulfill.
- 2. It reminds us of God's eternal presence. While we need to nurture our relationship with Jesus at all times of the year, Advent is a time that can help us to reflect on that relationship and how we can seek to draw closer to Him in the coming year.
- 3. Advent gives us hope and reminds us that Jesus Christ will return to this earth someday and that we need to renew and prepare our hearts every day for his return. The celebration of Advent is one that we share with Christians worldwide and helps us remember that we are united with one another as sisters and brothers in Christ.
