

#### THE MYSTERY OF THE BLESSED TRINITY

Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Church sets aside this Sunday to focus our attention on the mystery of the Blessed Trinity, God who is one, but three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The first reading from Deuteronomy emphasizes both God's awesome greatness and amazing nearness. It might seem beyond belief, but the God of all creation speaks to us, protects us, and guides us. The second reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans describes how we are to relate to the three persons who are one God. We are led by the Spirit to meet God the Father as adopted children. Our adoption is such that we are even heirs with our brother, Christ, the second person of the Trinity, in whose sufferings we must also share. #### LITURGY AND THE HOLY TRINITY

The Trinity is the central mystery of our faith. We believe that God is one, yet three: total unity and rich diversity. God is not a monolith, but a dynamic community of persons, a perfect, loving harmony of three. And the liturgy is the work of the Trinity. We begin all our liturgical celebrations with the sign of the cross, a reminder of our Trinitarian baptism, and the simplest of all professions of our faith. We believe that God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and we gather in the name of this triune God. Throughout the Mass, we address our prayers to God the Father, through Christ our Lord, in the Spirit's power. And the Father hears our prayer, transforming bread and wine into the Body and Blood of his Son by the Holy Spirit. The Church is "the sacrament of trinitarian communion" (Sacramentum Caritatis, 16). It is the Trinity who holds us together as well. In the words of Saint Cyprian, we are "a people made one by the unity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit" (quoted in Sacramentum Caritatis, 16).

#### **NEW COVID-19 PROTOCOLS**

Following Governors restriction changes that took effect on May 19<sup>th</sup>, churches in the Diocese of Rockville Centre will be carefully incorporating new rules including that:

- Dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation Masses remains in effect. We anticipate a future lifting of the dispensation together with the entire New York Province when we can accommodate our people without distancing limits.
- Beginning May 19, 2021, 100% of church's capacity may be occupied. However, some social distancing should remain in place as best as possible. There is a great deal of debate within the scientific community about the effectiveness of social distancing, and regulations vary from state to state. Schools are encouraged to maintain 3 feet, while businesses are told 6 feet. Currently, the NY State regulation is still 6 feet. Therefore, we can only do our best.
- Masks should continue to be worn, except by children under 2 years of age and those individuals with breathing difficulties. Priest celebrants do not wear masks during the celebration of Holy Mass, except during the distribution of Holy Communion.
- Processions may resume. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) defines "close contact" as being closer than 6 feet to another person for 15 minutes or more. Therefore, standard processions are safe.
- Collection baskets with attached poles can be used.
- The Sign of Peace may continue to be omitted at the pastor's discretion.
- The Precious Blood should not be distributed until further notice.
- Holy Water fonts should remain empty indefinitely.
- Parish activities can resume as well with procedures left to the discretion of the pastor. Other meetings / organizations (i.e. addiction support) may also resume with the same expectations regarding masks, reasonable distancing, reasonable cleaning, etc

May it please God to bring our long COVID winter to an end soon.
