

Drodzy Parafianie i Przyjaciele Koscioła

Naturalne pragnienie szczęścia człowieka ma "boskie pochodzenie: Bóg umieścił je w ludzkim sercu, aby przyciągnąć człowieka do Tego, który

sam może go wypełnić". Drugie zdanie Deklaracji Niepodległości przypomina to pragnienie: "Uważamy te prawdy za oczywiste, że wszyscy ludzie są równi, że są obdarzeni przez swego Stwórcę pewnymi niezbywalnymi prawami, że wśród nich sa Życie, Wolność i dążenie do szczęścia". W ten Dzień Niepodległości ważne jest, aby zastanowić się, co to znaczy szukać życia, wolności i szczęścia. Chociaż można bezpiecznie powiedzieć, że wszyscy pragną tych dóbr, nie wszyscy rozumieją, gdzie się znajdują. W rzeczywistości nie chodzi nawet o to, gdzie się znajdują, ale w kim się znajdują: "Ja jestem drogą i prawdą i życiem" (J 14, 6). Czy naprawdę pragniemy przede wszystkim kochać Boga ze względu na niego, stać się Jego dzieckiem i żyć jako członek boskiej rodziny? To są dary, które Bóg ofiarowuje człowiekowi. Są to dary, które Kościół przedstawia światu jako sakrament zbawienia, aby świat mógł być przyniesiony do Chrystusa.


LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners and Friends

Man's natural desire for happiness is of "divine origin: God has placed it in the human heart in order to draw man to the One who alone can fulfill

it" (CCC 1718). The second sentence of the Declaration of Independence echoes that desire: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." On this Independence Day, it is important to reflect on what it means to seek life, liberty and happiness. While it is safe to say everyone desires these goods, not everyone understands where they are found. 



FEAST OF FAITH LITTLE MYSTERIES

Two small rites—or, as one liturgist has called them, "little mysteries"—accompany the preparation of the gifts. The priest or deacon takes a small cruet of water from the server and adds a drop of water to the wine. Then, after the elevation of the chalice (and the incensation, if incense is used), the priest washes his hands. Both of these actions were at first practical, matter-of-fact realities: in the ancient world the wine was usually quite thick, and was generally mixed with water before it was drunk. And in the early church, when the faithful brought forward a great variety of gifts at this time, there was a definite need for the presider to wash his hands!

But now these rites serve a purely symbolic function. The mingling of the water and wine is accompanied by a prayer that speaks of the wonderful exchange of the Mass, the mingling of Christ's divinity and our humanity. And as the priest washes his hands, he prays words of supplication from Psalm 51, acknowledging his own sinfulness in the presence of the assembly before he dares to approach the altar for this most sacred action.
