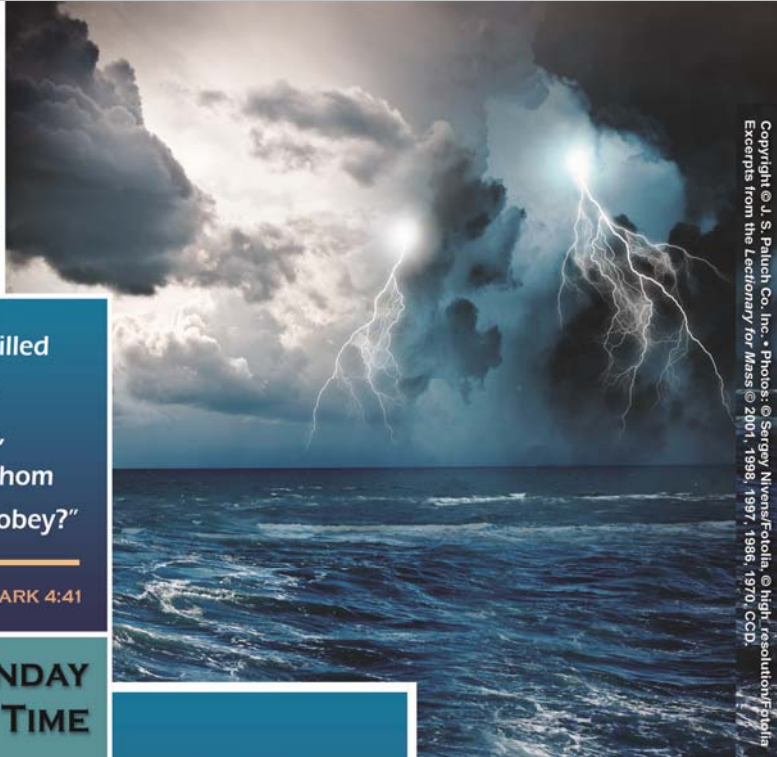

LIST KSIĘDZA PROBOSZCZA

Drodzy Parafianie i Przyjaciele Kościoła

Dzisiaj, w tych czasach «gęstej mgły» zadajemy to samo ewangeliczne pytanie. Ludzkość przeżyła dramaty, które jak silne fale przetoczyły się nad mężczyznami i kobietami, i całymi narodami, w szczególności te w XX wieku i na początku XXI. I czasem z głębi duszy wydobywa się wołanie: «Nauczycielu, nic Cię to nie obchodzi, że ginimy?» (Mk 4,38); jeśli naprawdę istniejesz, jeśli Ty jesteś Ojcem, dlaczego dzieją się te rzeczy? Bóg nie odpowie na te pytania: możemy pytać Go o wszystko tylko nie o przyczynę rzeczy; nie mamy prawa żądać, by się przed nami tłumaczył. W rzeczywistości Bóg wciąż i wciąż do nas mówi; i to my jesteśmy tymi, którzy nie stają w jego obecności i dlatego nie słyszymy jego głosu. «To my — mówi Benedykt XVI — nie jesteśmy w stanie ocenić tajemnicy Boga. Widzimy tylko fragmenty i mylimy się chcąc być sędziami Boga i historii. Przez to nie jesteśmy obrońcami człowieka, lecz bierzemy udział w zniszczeniu». Nie zadawajmy Mu pytań, a raczej módlmy się i słuchajmy jego woli i..., wtedy właśnie będzie mniej tragedii..., i wówczas zadziwieni zawołamy: «Kim właściwie On jest, że nawet wicher i jezioro są Mu posłuszne?» (Mk 4,41). — Jezu, ufam Tobie!

LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners and Friends

Today —in these days of «stormy weather»— we find the Gospel being held up to questioning. Humanity has gone through dramas which, like violent waves, have broken over individuals and entire peoples, particularly during the 20th century and the troubles of the 21st. Sometimes we can't help but ask «Master, don't you care if we sink?» (Mk 4,38); If You really do exist, if You are our Father, how can these things happen? God will not answer those questions: of him we can ask everything except why; we have no right to demand explanations. In fact, God is there and is talking; the problem is us, because we do not put ourselves in his presence and therefore cannot hear his voice. «We cannot decipher God's secret —says Pope Benedict XI—. We can only see fragments of it and are in the wrong if what we are trying is to become judges of God and History. As such we would not be defending humanity, but rather would be contributing to its destruction». Let us not ask him questions, but rather let us pray and accept His will and... then there will be less dramas, and, amazed, we will say «Who is he whom even the wind and the sea obey him?» (Mc 4,41) —Jesus, I put all my trust in you!

FEAST OF FAITH

As the altar is prepared for the celebration of the Eucharist, the collection is taken up. In the early church, this part of the Mass must have been something to behold, as the people suddenly began to move, bringing forward to the deacons and priests freshly-baked bread and fine wine. Then, after the Eucharistic Prayer, that same community came forward again in the Communion procession, and they received back the very gifts they had given, now transformed into something infinitely more precious than bread and wine: the very Body and Blood of Christ.

Beginning around the eleventh century, it became the custom for people to present money instead of bread and wine, and the procession of the faithful gradually disappeared (it survives in the liturgy of Holy Thursday). But the meaning is the same. We continue to bring the fruit of our labors and to offer them freely to God. And God continues to transform them into Christ. It is through our generous sharing of time, talent, and treasure that our parishes can preach the gospel, reach out to the sick and the imprisoned, and celebrate the sacraments.
